The Association of Taxation Technicians, the oldest and largest body concerned solely with tax compliance, announced today the results of its examinations taken by 809 candidates in November 2023 with an additional 1,000 sitting some ATT papers on the ATT CTA Tax Pathway. The Association reports that a high standard of performance was achieved by many candidates.

The Association President, Simon Groom, commenting upon the results said:

“I am delighted to congratulate all the successful candidates from the November sitting of our exams. In total 809 ATT candidates and 495 ATT CTA Tax Pathway candidates sat 1,743 papers and 1,328 passes were achieved. 92 distinctions were awarded to candidates for outstanding performance.

With my background in tax education I am well aware of the many hours of study required to sit our examinations and I commend all the candidates for putting in the work necessary to achieve success.

The ATT’s modular system means that candidates can study at their own pace, within the five-year registration period, whether they are working towards full membership or simply wishing to obtain one or more Certificates of Competency in their specialist area.

I look forward to meeting the candidates who take up membership at our next Admission Ceremony.”

The Ivison Medal

The Ivison Medal has been awarded to Megan Amy Yorke of Castleford, who is employed by Kirk Newsholme Chartered Accountants in Leeds.

The Ivison Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 1 – Personal Taxation.

The Jennings Medal

The Jennings Medal has been awarded to James Shepherd of Salford, who is employed by KPMG LLP in Manchester.

The Jennings Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 2 – Business Taxation.

The Collingwood Medal

The Collingwood Medal has been awarded to Mariia Podosenova of London where she is employed by Deloitte LLP.

The Collingwood Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 3 – Business Compliance.

The Stary Medal

The Stary Medal has been awarded to James Shepherd, winner of the Jennings Medal.

The Stary Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation.

The Kimmer Medal

The Kimmer Medal has been awarded to Charlotte Buckley of Rotherham who is employed by KPMG LLP in Watford.

The Kimmer Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates.

The Gravestock Medal

The Gravestock Medal has been awarded to Isaac Keith Dilley of London where he is employed by Warrener Stewart.

The Gravestock Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 6 – VAT.

The Johnson Medal

The Johnson Medal has been awarded to Agata Proc of Worthing where she is employed by Ayres Bright Vickers.

The Johnson Medal is awarded to the candidate with the best overall performance when passing the Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics, Law and Principles of Accounting within a six month period.

The Tolley Prize

The Tolley Prize has been awarded to Mariia Podosenova, winner of the Collingwood Medal.

The Tolley Prize is awarded to the candidate taking three tax papers at one sitting and obtaining the highest total marks on those three papers.

The President's Medal

The President's Medal has been awarded to Sophie Louisa Wright of Walsall, who is employed by EY in Birmingham.

The President's Medal is awarded at the discretion of the President to an outstanding candidate or candidates not otherwise eligible for a prize.

Prizes and Medals are only awarded provided the papers are of a sufficiently high standard.

The Association Medal has not been awarded on this occasion.

Distinctions

Passes with Distinction for each Certificate paper are listed on the accompanying document.

Distinctions are only awarded to candidates whose answers reflect an exceptional level in a paper.

ATT Certificate paper results

Paper 1 – Personal Taxation

378 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 529 sitting the examination with 30 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 71%.

Paper 2 – Business Taxation

497 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 643 sitting the examination with 31 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 77%.

Paper 3 – Business Compliance

115 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 135 sitting the examination with 8 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 85%.

Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation

223 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 261 sitting the examination with 14 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 85%.

Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates

71 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 119 sitting the examination with 6 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 60%.

Paper 6 – VAT

44 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 56 sitting the examination with 3 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 79%.
