The Association of Taxation Technicians, the oldest and largest body concerned solely with tax compliance, announced today the results of its examinations taken by 830 candidates in May 2025 with an additional 554 candidates who sat one or more ATT papers on the ATT CTA Tax Pathway. The Association reports that a high standard of performance was achieved by many candidates.

The Association President, Graham Batty, commenting upon the results said:

"I am delighted to congratulate all the successful candidates from the May sitting of our exams. In total 830 ATT candidates and 554 ATT CTA Tax Pathway candidates sat 1,785 papers and 1,305 passes were achieved. 94 distinctions were awarded to candidates for outstanding performance.

Having taken professional exams myself I have personal experience of the many hours of study and sacrifice of your social life required to sit these examinations. I commend all the candidates for putting in the long hours and effort necessary.

The ATT's modular system means that candidates can study at their own pace, within the five-year registration period, whether they are working towards full membership or simply wishing to obtain one or more Certificates of Competency in their specialist area.

I look forward to meeting the candidates who take up membership at our next Admission Ceremony."

The Association Medal

The Association Medal has been awarded to Perla Hoffman of London where they are employed by Stone & Co Services Ltd.

The Association Medal is awarded to the candidate passing their final exam at the current session and achieving the highest aggregate marks over all exams.

The Ivison Medal

The Ivison Medal has been awarded to Lucy Jane Downes of Leeds where they are employed by RSM UK.

The Ivison Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 1 – Personal Taxation.

The Jennings Medal

The Jennings Medal has been awarded to Freya Tuulikki Webb of Shrewsbury where they are employed by WR Partners.

The Jennings Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 2 – Business Taxation.

The Collingwood Medal

The Collingwood Medal has been awarded to Sameer Hussain of Watford where they are employed by Vialto Partners.

The Collingwood Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 3 – Business Compliance.

The Stary Medal

The Stary Medal has been awarded to Perla Hoffman, winner of the Association Medal. The Stary Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation.

The Kimmer Medal

The Kimmer Medal has been awarded to Brogan Howe of Cowdenbeath and they are employed by EQ Chartered Accountants in Fife.

The Kimmer Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates.

The Gravestock Medal

The Gravestock Medal has been awarded to Rebecca Watt of Stockport and they are employed by Deloitte LLP in Salford.

The Gravestock Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 6 – VAT.

The Johnson Medal

The Johnson Medal has been jointly awarded to Charlotte Helen Cade of Reading and they are employed by KPMG LLP and Matthew Ian Chong of Manchester and they are employed by KPMG LLP in Watford.

The Johnson Medal is awarded to the candidate with the best overall performance when passing the Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics, Law and Principles of Accounting within a six month period.

The Tolley Prize

The Tolley Prize has been awarded to Elizabeth Andree Swain of London where they are employed by Blick Rothenberg Ltd.

The Tolley Prize is awarded to the candidate taking three tax papers at one sitting and obtaining the highest total marks on those three papers.

The President's Medal has not been awarded on this occasion.

Prizes and Medals are only awarded provided the papers are of a sufficiently high standard.

Distinctions

Passes with Distinction for each Certificate paper are listed on the accompanying document. Distinctions are only awarded to candidates whose answers reflect an exceptional level in a paper.

ATT Certificate paper results

Paper 1 – Personal Taxation

465 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 685 sitting the examination with 34 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 68%.

Paper 2 – Business Taxation

402 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 551 sitting the examination with 30 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 73%.

Paper 3 – Business Compliance

99 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 111 sitting the examination with 7 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 89%.

Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation

167 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 213 sitting the examination with 12 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 78%.

Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates

92 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 121 sitting the examination with 6 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 76%.

Paper 6 – VAT

80 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 104 sitting the examination with 5 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 77%.
