The Association of Taxation Technicians, the oldest and largest body concerned solely with tax compliance, announced today the results of its examination taken by 966 candidates on 8 and 9 May 2019. The Association reports that a high standard of performance was achieved by many candidates.

The Association President, Jeremy Coker, commenting upon the results said:

"I am delighted to congratulate all the successful candidates from the May sitting of our exams. In total 966 candidates sat 1,786 papers and 1,349 passes were achieved with 94 distinctions awarded for outstanding performance.

The Association Medal

The Association Medal is awarded to the candidate taking three written papers at one sitting obtaining the best overall result including having passed both Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics and Law.

The Ivison Medal

The Ivison Medal has been awarded to Meera Alkesh Desai of West Harrow.

The Ivison Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 1 – Personal Taxation.

The Jennings Medal

The Jennings Medal has been awarded to Elspeth Jamieson of Edinburgh who is employed by Johnston Carmichael (Scotland) Ltd in Elgin.

The Jennings Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 2 – Business Taxation.

The Collingwood Medal

The Collingwood Medal has been awarded to Katrina Sutherland of Glasgow who is employed by Skills Development Scotland in Stirling.

The Collingwood Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 3 – Business Compliance.

The Stary Medal

The Stary Medal has been awarded to Elspeth Jamieson, winner of the Jennings Medal.

The Stary Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation.

The Kimmer Medal

The Kimmer Medal has been awarded to Celia Northern of Bedford, where she is employed by MHA MacIntryre Hudson.

The Kimmer Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates.

The Gravestock Medal

The Gravestock Medal has been awarded to Emma Robinson of Belfast, where she is employed by PwC.

The Gravestock Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 6 – VAT.

The Johnson Medal

The Johnson Medal has been awarded to Amelia Hay of Wilmslow, where she is employed by Rock Advisory.

The Johnson Medal is awarded to the candidate with the best overall performance when passing both the Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics and Law within a six month period.

The Tolley Prize

The Tolley Prize has been awarded to Elouise Everett of Dover.

The Tolley Prize is awarded to the candidate taking three written papers at one sitting and obtaining the highest total marks on those three papers.

The President's Medal

The President's Medal has been awarded to Lilly-Ann Walters of Cardiff, where she is employed by Deloitte LLP.

The President's Medal is awarded at the discretion of the President to an outstanding candidate or candidates not otherwise eligible for a prize.

Prizes and Medals are only awarded provided the papers are of a sufficiently high standard.

Distinctions

Passes with Distinction for each Certificate paper are listed on the accompanying document. Distinctions are only awarded to candidates whose answers reflect an exceptional level in a paper.

ATT Certificate paper results

Paper 1 – Personal Taxation

522 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 743 sitting the examination with 41 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 70%.

Paper 2 – Business Taxation

428 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 536 sitting the examination with 28 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 80%.

Paper 3 – Business Compliance

131 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 143 sitting the examination with 7 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 92%.

Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation

152 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 207 sitting the examination with 10 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 73%.

Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates

66 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 77 sitting the examination with 6 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 86%.

Paper 6 – VAT

50 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 80 sitting the examination with 2 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 63%.
