



## **PASS AND PRIZE LIST**

May 2022 Examination

The Association of Taxation Technicians, the oldest and largest body concerned solely with tax compliance, announced today the results of its examination taken by 784 candidates in May 2022 with an additional 948 sitting some ATT papers on the ATT CTA Tax Pathway. The Association reports that a high standard of performance was achieved by many candidates.

The Association President, David Bradshaw, commenting upon the results said:

“I am delighted to congratulate all the successful candidates from the May sitting of our exams. In total 1,273 ATT candidates sat 1,774 papers and 1,308 passes were achieved with 84 distinctions awarded for outstanding performance.

All the tax exams continued to be held remotely and I would like to applaud the candidates for their commitment and resilience.

Our modular system means that candidates can study at their own pace, whether they are working towards full membership or simply wishing to obtain one or more Certificates of Competency in their specialist area. This flexibility continues to be popular.

I look forward to meeting as many new members as possible at one of our future admission ceremonies.”

### **The Association Medal**

The Association Medal has been awarded to Zoe Michelle Janaway of Bournemouth, who is employed by Deloitte LLP in London.

*The Association Medal is awarded to the candidate taking three tax papers at one sitting obtaining the best overall result including having passed the Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics, Law and Principles of Accounting.*

### **The Ivison Medal**

The Ivison Medal has been awarded to Emily Hurdley of Sheffield where she is employed by Shorts Accountants.

*The Ivison Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 1 – Personal Taxation.*

### **The Jennings Medal**

The Jennings Medal has been awarded to Soumya Chadha of Serilingampally, India where she is employed by Deloitte.

*The Jennings Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 2 – Business Taxation.*

### **The Collingwood Medal**

The Collingwood Medal has been awarded to Oliver Jack Henderson of London where he is employed by Deloitte LLP.

*The Collingwood Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 3 – Business Compliance.*

**The Stary Medal**

The Stary Medal has been awarded to Soumya Chadha of Serilingampally, India, winner of the Jennings Medal.

*The Stary Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation.*

**The Kimmer Medal**

The Kimmer Medal has been awarded to Charles Whittle of Bures, who is employed by Whiting & Partners in Bury St Edmunds.

*The Kimmer Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates.*

**The Gravestock Medal**

The Gravestock Medal has been awarded to Nuria Guilera Margenat of Edenbridge, who is employed by RSM UK Management in Crawley.

*The Gravestock Medal is awarded to the candidate with the highest mark in Paper 6 – VAT.*

**The Johnson Medal**

The Johnson Medal has been awarded to Emma Jade Alvarez of Esher, who is employed by Buzzacott LLP in London.

*The Johnson Medal is awarded to the candidate with the best overall performance when passing the Computer Based Examinations in Professional Responsibilities & Ethics, Law and Principles of Accounting within a six month period.*

**The Tolley Prize**

The Tolley Prize has been awarded to Oliver Jack Henderson of London, winner of the Collingwood Medal.

*The Tolley Prize is awarded to the candidate taking three tax papers at one sitting and obtaining the highest total marks on those three papers.*

**The President's Medal**

The President's Medal has been awarded to Beatrice Eleanor Ballamy, of London where she is employed by EY.

*The President's Medal is awarded at the discretion of the President to an outstanding candidate or candidates not otherwise eligible for a prize.*

Prizes and Medals are only awarded provided the papers are of a sufficiently high standard.

**Distinctions**

Passes with Distinction for each Certificate paper are listed on the accompanying document. Distinctions are only awarded to candidates whose answers reflect an exceptional level in a paper.

## **ATT Certificate paper results**

### Paper 1 – Personal Taxation

504 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 681 sitting the examination with 34 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 74%.

### Paper 2 – Business Taxation

423 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 610 sitting the examination with 26 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 69%.

### Paper 3 – Business Compliance

129 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 158 sitting the examination with 8 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 82%.

### Paper 4 – Corporate Taxation

162 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 188 sitting the examination with 10 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 86%.

### Paper 5 – Inheritance Tax, Trusts & Estates

54 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 88 sitting the examination with 4 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 61%.

### Paper 6 – VAT

36 candidates passed this paper out of a total of 49 sitting the examination with 2 candidates being awarded a distinction. A pass rate of 73%.
